# LONG BIOGRAPHY

My name is Taylor, and I am a writer, Bible teacher, speaker, women's ministry leader, wife, and mom to our chaos crew of five. I was adopted at birth, and at nineteen, my husband and I welcomed our son unexpectedly, long before we understood how completely Jesus would reach for our hearts and change the course of our lives. What could have become a story marked only by fear and uncertainty instead became the place where God began drawing us toward Himself with absolutely relentless grace.

I owe absolutely everything I have to Jesus. Every part of my life that has been so boldly redeemed, rebuilt, softened, strengthened, or healed has come from His mercy. Because of that, I yearn deeply for other women to experience both the freedom and the fire that come with following Him. The freedom of no longer building a life around fear, approval, self-protection, or borrowed convictions, and the fire of a faith that requires often painful surrender, reaches into every unseen part of us, and makes us more alive than comfort ever could.

My heart is to help women know the Word of God for themselves, now more than ever, as the lines of truth and reality continue to be blurred by our enemy. My prayer is that women would live boldly in obedience to Jesus and embrace His vision for holy community. Scripture calls us to speak the truth in love, restore one another gently, carry each other's burdens, stir one another toward love and good works, and refuse to abandon gathering together. That kind of community is not always comfortable, but it is always worth it.

The enemy is pressing us every day toward dangerous isolation, convincing us that we are safer alone, and the Church must press back. We are slowly abandoning the community that sharpens us, retreating from the people who know us well enough to point us back to Jesus when we stray, and looking for churches that simply feed us rather than becoming people who serve, endure, forgive, and remain. While the world around us grows more divided, let unity begin with God's daughters, not built on the shallow ties of agreement, but rooted in the holy, countercultural ground of humility, truth, patience, and the same relentless grace He showed us first.

Our family has the privilege of calling the beautiful state of Georgia home, where we love bounding between sandy beaches and musty log cabins in Appalachia. My life is full, often loud, rarely polished, and completely dependent on Jesus. And my hope for our time together is not simply to leave women inspired, but to help them become more rooted in truth, more courageous in obedience, more willing to be known, and more fully alive to the life Jesus has always had in store for them.
